DRESS CODE

<u>Purpose</u>: To foster a professional, safe and respectful school environment. The dress code is in effect from the time students arrive to school and until they leave. The dress code applies to field trips, site visits, academic internships, and other school-related activities, unless the supervising adult informs the students otherwise.

*Students must be in collared tops at all times, with the only exception being a Da Vinci t-shirt. No article of clothing may have patches, frayed material, or language/content deemed inappropriate by the school administration.

**The highlighted policies are the rules that are most commonly violated. Please be especially aware of these rules.
