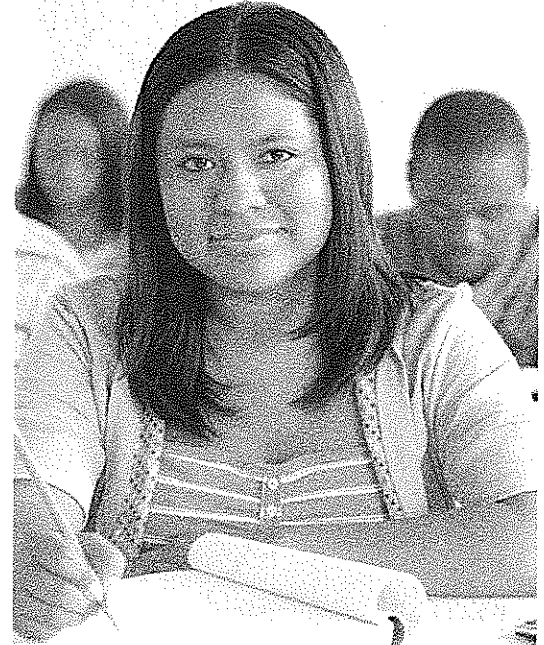

The Watts Counseling and Learning Center is a nonprofit Community Benefit program of Kaiser Permanente Southern California. Since 1967, the Center has provided counseling, outreach, and educational services to the residents of the Watts community. Kaiser Permanente Health Plan membership is not required to receive these services.

Counseling Programs

Counseling — The Center provides individual, family, marital, parent-child, and group therapy in English and Spanish.

Kids Can Cope — Children whose parents or siblings have or had cancer or other life-threatening illness can receive innovative, specialized counseling and support groups.

School Outreach Services — The Center provides psycho-educational groups at local schools.

Internships — Graduate social work interns receive professional fieldwork education supervised by licensed clinical staff.

Partnering schools include the University of California, Los Angeles, University of Southern California, California State University at Long Beach and Los Angeles, and Smith College in Massachusetts.

Educational Programs

Educational Therapy — Students with learning difficulties receive educational assessments and individual/small group educational therapy sessions. Special educational advocacy and parent training is also available.

Internships — Graduate educational therapy interns receive professional training supervised by Board Certified staff. Partnering schools include UC Riverside and California State University Northridge.

Outreach Programs

Reading Enrichment — Students participate in weekly sessions that build enthusiasm for reading through various activities and reading materials.

Homework Help Club — Elementary grade students receive after school homework assistance.

Math Tutoring — Elementary through high school students receive individualized math assistance.

Personal Development — Mentoring, goal setting and personal enhancement opportunities are provided for middle school students in a group setting.

Academic Coaching — In partnership with the school and the parent, high school students receive individual/small group academic guidance in order to develop an academic plan with agreed upon goals and objectives.

College Bound Support Services — High school students receive college planning information through meetings or workshops. In collaboration with The Princeton Review, students planning to take the SAT/ACT exam(s) participate in test preparation courses.

Youth Work Preparation Certificate Program — High school students take part in an annual seven-week program focusing on work skills and health care careers. High school students ages 16 and older participate in a summer youth employment program.

Child Development

Preschool Education for Parents and Children (PEPC) is full day early childhood education program that develops school-readiness skills and motivates preschool children to enjoy learning. PEPC is both state licensed and nationally accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC). Ongoing parent education groups are also part of the program. Tuition is based on a nominal sliding-scale fee.



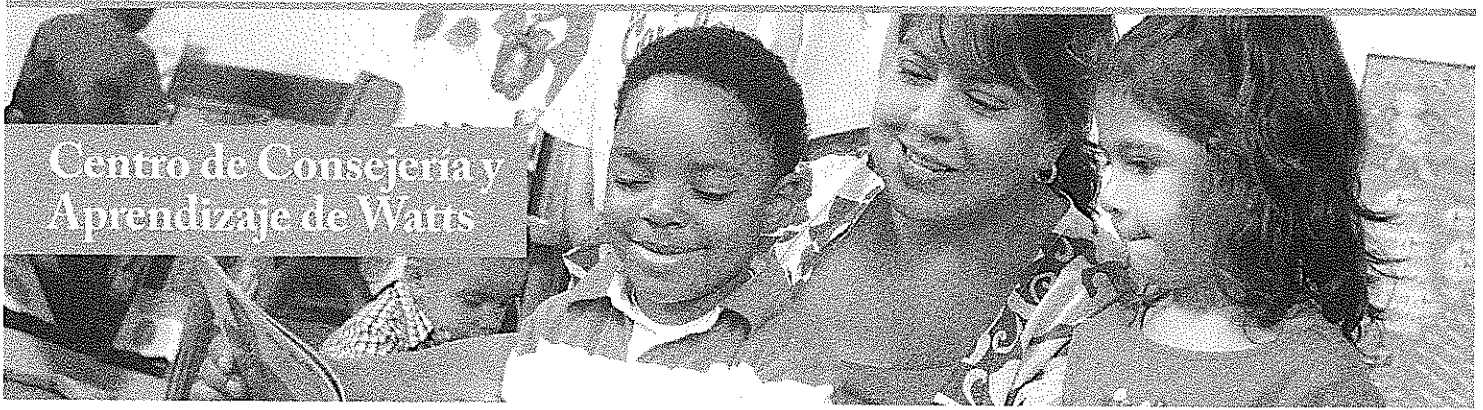

El Centro de Aprendizaje y Consejería de Kaiser Permanente en Watts es un programa de beneficios comunitarios sin fines de lucro. Desde 1967, el Centro ha ofrecido servicios de consejería, educación y apoyo comunitario a los residentes de la comunidad de Watts. No es necesario ser miembro de Kaiser Permanente para recibir estos servicios.

Programas de consejería

Consejería — El centro ofrece servicios de terapia individual, familiar, de pareja, para padres e hijos y terapia en grupo, en español y en inglés.

Kids Can Cope — El programa brinda servicios innovadores y especializados de consejería y grupos de apoyo a niños cuyos padres o hermanos tienen o han tenido cáncer u otras enfermedades que ponen en riesgo la vida.

Servicios de apoyo escolar — El centro ofrece servicios de consejería en grupo sobre una variedad de temas de comportamiento y de desarrollo personal.

Trabajo de formación — Los estudiantes que están haciendo un posgrado en trabajo social reciben pasantías o capacitación profesional supervisada por personal titulado. Las universidades que participan incluyen las siguientes: University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA), University of Southern California (USC), California State University, Long Beach (CSULB), California State University, Los Angeles (CSULA), y Smith College en Massachusetts.

Programas educativos

Terapia educativa — Estudiantes con problemas de aprendizaje participan en sesiones de terapia educacional individual y en grupos pequeños. También se brindan evaluaciones académicas, apoyo educativo y capacitación para padres de familia en el área de educación especial.

Trabajo de formación — Se ofrecen pasantías o trabajo de formación a estudiantes de posgrado en terapia educacional supervisada por personal titulado.

Programas de alcance comunitario

Enriquecimiento a través de la lectura — Los estudiantes participan en sesiones semanales que fomentan el interés por la lectura a través de diferentes actividades.

Ayuda con las tareas escolares — Los estudiantes de primaria reciben asistencia con sus tareas escolares después de clases.

Tutoría de matemáticas — Los estudiantes de primaria hasta preparatoria reciben ayuda individualizada en matemáticas.

Grupos de desarrollo personal — Se brinda ayuda a estudiantes de escuela secundaria para establecer metas para el futuro y desarrollar su carácter.

Apoyo académico — En colaboración con la escuela y el padre de familia, los estudiantes de preparatoria reciben orientación individual o en grupos pequeños con el fin de desarrollar un plan académico.

Servicios de apoyo para la universidad — Los estudiantes de preparatoria reciben información sobre cómo planear su ingreso a la universidad. En colaboración con la organización The Princeton Review, los estudiantes que planean tomar el examen SAT/ACT participan en cursos de preparación para el examen.

Programa certificado de preparación laboral para jóvenes — Los estudiantes de preparatoria participan en un programa anual de siete semanas donde aprenden destrezas laborales y obtienen información sobre las carreras en el campo de la medicina. Los estudiantes de preparatoria mayores de 16 años también tienen la oportunidad de participar en un programa laboral de verano para jóvenes.

Desarrollo infantil

PEPC (Preschool Education for Parents and Children, Educación Preescolar para Padres y Niños) es un programa de nivel preescolar que ayuda a los niños a prepararse para la escuela y los motiva a disfrutar del aprendizaje. PEPC tiene licencia estatal y acreditación nacional por la NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children). Los grupos educativos para los padres forman parte del programa preescolar de manera continua. La colegiatura se basa en una tarifa mínima según los ingresos.



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
