

Families/Parents/Guardians of 9th grade Da Vinci Design Students,

We are thrilled to share with you that we will be continuing the **Career Pathways** courses with our freshman class this spring. Long term, there will be two Career Pathways students will be able to choose from once they reach grade 11: **Architecture/Environmental Design or Graphic Design**. Students will take all of the same classes in 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade via their Art & Design courses to gain exposure to both fields, and then they will choose a pathway before the start of their 11<sup>th</sup> grade year to become more focused in their coursework.

We have been working alongside **El Camino College (ECC)** for our Architecture/Environmental Design pathway and with **UCLA Extension (UCLAX)** for our Graphic Design/User Experience pathway. Students will be eligible to earn credits in the courses listed below. The tentative course sequence for 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade classes is as follows:

For Architecture, we have courses tentatively planned for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade each semester for this pathway that will cover architectural drafting, Computer Aided Drafting (CAD) and modeling, and sustainable design. The same goes for the Graphic Design pathway. These options will be released this spring and you will be able to discuss them in further detail with the counselors at family meetings which will begin next spring for your student.

The long term goal of the Architecture pathways is that students would be able to earn up to 12 units in Architecture and Environmental Design by the end of their senior year. There is also an additional CAD class that students can take in the summer at El Camino College after their 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade year. All of the units/credits earned could be applied toward a certificate or an Associate's Degree (A.S) in Architecture from El Camino College. These could also prove transferable to a 4-year college or university, although that is program dependent and determined by those colleges and universities, not Da Vinci. Our college counselors can help you navigate that process when the time comes. Students will also be able to gain up to 12 units in the graphic design pathway and will receive a custom certificate from UCLA Extension upon successful completion of all required coursework.

All of the pathway classes will be co-taught by our Da Vinci teachers and an expert in the field who will serve as the professor from El Camino College. We are seeking this balance to ensure that the project-based learning and culture we value at Da Vinci Design is still present while students learn the content from these college courses.

The first class, Orientation to Architecture, is a 1-unit class, and students will cover the course content through the 9<sup>th</sup> Grade Exhibition project this spring. Cari Werz, the Art & Design 1 teacher, will teach the content alongside the professor, Joe Carlos, who is experienced in the field and has his Master's Degree in Architecture from SciArc in Los Angeles.

**In order for students to receive their much deserved college credit, they will need to <u>apply to El Camino</u> <u>College online</u> and <u>complete a Concurrent Enrollment form</u>. Our counselors will aid students in the application process at the end of this month during their Art & Design classes.** 

We will need the support of the families in getting students enrolled. This information can be found if you continue onto the next page.

- Please fill out the El Camino College Application Checklist
  - Students will use this while filling out the online application during class with counselors
- Please fill out the Concurrent Enrollment Form "Student Information" and "Parent Consent" sections

- Students will need their Social Security number to apply (this links to financial aid in the future)
