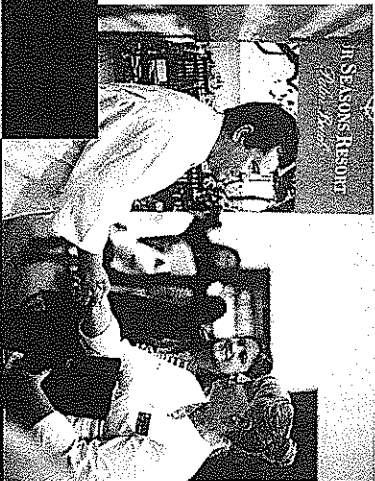

Costs

If you live **MORE than a 6-hour drive** from campus, but within the continental U.S., you're eligible for our fly-in option. Costs for your course selections are as follows:

Things to Know

APPLICATION PROCESS

The Summer College 2017 application is NOW LIVE!

Important Information Regarding the Application Process:

1. The Summer College online application is hosted in association with Summer at Syracuse. It can be found at <https://summeratsyracuse.slideroom.com/>
2. An account must be created. *Please use the name of the student when creating the account and provide an email address that is checked regularly as this will be the primary mode of communication.*
3. After you establish your account, you will be required to click on the link in a confirmation e-mail sent to you by SlideRoom.
4. Once you login, click on "Start a New Submission."
5. On the left, and under "Category," select "Summer College for High School."
6. Select the Summer College Application for your desired program of study and continue through the application steps.

Admissions Criteria

Students applying to Summer College are expected to be in good academic standing with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. Students must be a minimum of 15 years of age by the orientation and move-in day of their selected program except for engineering programs. Students applying to the Civil, Aerospace or Environmental Engineering must be rising Juniors or Seniors.

The Summer College application procedure asks students to complete the online application through SlideRoom, and additionally supply:

- A teacher or guidance counselor recommendation that addresses the applicant's maturity, self-discipline, and potential for success in a college-level program of study
- A high school transcript supplemented with a copy of the most recent report card. It can be an unofficial or official grade report.
- Applicants for Acting and Musical Theater are required to submit an audition.
- Students applying to the following Art and Design programs are asked to submit a portfolio of 2 – 3 pieces of recent work, which can be uploaded with your application. A portfolio is not required for students applying to the Architecture, Filmmaking, or Photography programs.

Application Deadlines

- The deadline for scholarship applications – April 1, 2017
- The deadline for international applications – April 15, 2017
- The deadline for completed applications – May 15, 2017

Earlier applications are strongly encouraged, as most programs have limited enrollment. All applications are processed in the order they are received.

Scholarships

Summer College does offer **need-based aid** for admitted students. Aid is only available to domestic students, and is provided on a first-come, first-serve basis as funds are limited. In order to be considered, students must submit their family's most recent tax returns with their application.

**Scholarships cannot be combined with multi-program, employee, or alumni discounts. If a student is eligible for multiple forms of aid, then s/he will be deemed eligible for the singular form of financial assistance providing the greatest benefit to the student.*

All awards are **need-based**. The following is a guideline of the maximum **potential award**. Awards may be in any amount up to

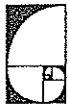
ARTS EDUCATION & CREATIVE TECHNOLOGY**Organization:** Kadenze (Valencia, CA)**Career Field(s):** Arts, Education, Media/Entertainment**Program Dates:** July 8 – July 28, 2017 (3 weeks)

Two students will have an opportunity to work with Harmony Jiroudek, Director of Academic Customer Relations, and Scott Groller, Director of Production & Photography at Kadenze. Kadenze is an education technology company that has partnered with several art institutions to provide access to the highest quality online interactive courses and an engaged network of schools, instructors, and students. Kadenze fills a void in the massive open online course (MOOC) education world, as there are no arts-focused platforms that can deliver a specialized art experience or assessments tailored for artists and art students. Students will assist in the production of Kadenze courses by performing such tasks as course scheduling, course research and development, and course management. Students will also have a unique chance to help with a shoot at their Studio. By the end of the program, students will have the ability to collaborate and problem solve with large and small teams, gain experience scheduling, organizing, and interacting with multiple disciplines, and have a better understanding of project management.

BIOMATHEMATICS**Organization:** UCLA (Los Angeles, CA)**Career Field(s):** Science/Technology/Engineering, Health/Medicine**Program dates:** July 8 – July 28, 2017 (3 weeks)

Two students will have the opportunity to work with UCLA Professor, Dr. Van Savage, and his team of researchers in the Department of Biomathematics and Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology. The students will use mathematical approaches to understand the causes and consequences of the extraordinary diversity in form and function that exist in biological systems. This site involves independent research as well as data analysis to discover how organismal physiology influences biological structure and dynamics. By the end of the session, students will learn to use Angicart software to extract data from medical images, write code in Matlab to analyze data, and learn to translate key concepts in mathematical equations.

Prerequisites: Strong written and oral communication skills, experience in Microsoft Office, strong biology and physics skills, and interest in web design and database language. Applicants must be 15 years of age or older at the start of the program to be placed at this site.



COMPUTER SCIENCE

Organization: UCLA (Los Angeles, CA)

Career Field(s): Science/Technology/Engineering

Program dates: June 17 - July 28, 2017 (6 weeks)

Two students will have an opportunity to work with UCLA adjunct professor and head of the Laboratory for Advanced Systems Research (LASR), Dr. Peter Reiher. THE LASR conducts important research in many areas related to networks, operating systems, and distributed system. Under Dr. Reiher's guidance, students will not only gain a better understanding of computer and network security, but will also learn about advanced network attack and defense mechanisms.

Prerequisites: Programming experience, preferably in C or C++.

ETHNOMUSICOLOGY

Organization: Apsara Media for Intercultural Education (Valley Glen, CA)

Career Field(s): Arts, Education, Media/Entertainment, Science/Technology

Program dates: July 8 – July 28, 2017 (3 weeks)

Two students will have an opportunity to work with UCLA Adjunct Professor, Dr. Amy Catlin-Jairazboy. Dr. Catlin-Jairazbhoy has a background in Classical and non-classical music of South and Southeast Asians and Asian-Americans, field methodology, Ethnographic Film in Ethnomusicology, music and the sacred, and applied and public sector Ethnomusicology. Currently, she conducts a Literacy Program for Sidi African-Indians in Gujarat, India. She maintains Apsara Media for Intercultural Education, her small publication and research company and studio in Valley Glen, California, where she works with her audio-visual and research archives. The student will have an opportunity to work with Dr. Catlin-Jairazbhoy at Aspara Media which contains field documentation materials created by her and Professor N.A. Jairazbhoy. The student will learn methods of metadata production concerning field recordings and information to prepare for archiving at UCLA and methods of editing original audiovisual materials in preparation for further research and publication.

Prerequisites: Interest in film and music. Technologically savvy and possess basic video editing skills. Organized and independent, self-starter.

EVOLUTIONARY BIOLOGY

Organization: UCLA (Los Angeles, CA)

Career Field(s): Science/Technology/Engineering, Health/Medicine

Program dates: July 8 – July 28, 2017 (3 weeks)

Two students will work with volunteer mentor, Dr. Pamela Yeh, in the Department of Ecology and Evolutionary Biology at UCLA. Dr. Yeh is an evolutionary biologist who focuses on the evolution of drug resistance in bacteria. She is specifically interested in understanding how we can use drug combinations to slow down the evolution of increased antibiotic resistance and to decrease the likelihood of future evolution of resistance. By the end of the session, students will gain hands-on experience synthesizing and analyzing data from already-published research works and will collaborate with a team to examine



questions focused on evolutionary medicine topics. Please note that work will not be done in the wet lab.

Prerequisites: Applicants must be 16 years of age or older at the start of the program to be placed at this site.

PEDIATRIC MEDICAL RESEARCH

Organization: Children's Hospital Los Angeles (Los Angeles, CA)

Career Field(s): Health/Medicine, Science/Technology

Program dates: June 17 - July 28, 2017 (6 weeks)

Two students will work in the laboratory of Dr. Henri Ford of Pediatric Surgery at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. Students will study the pathogenesis of necrotizing enterocolitis, a devastating intestinal disease in premature infants. The students will work with experts in intestinal physiology, molecular biology, and functional genomics. The focus of the research activity is to look at molecular pathways that predispose the intestinal barrier to destruction.

Prerequisites: Courses completed in biology and/or other sciences, interest in medicine, demonstrated leadership, and organization and time-management skills. Applicants must be 15 years of age or older at the start of the program to be placed at this site.

Art Center College of Design (Pasadena, CA)

Career Field(s): Arts, Product Design

Program dates: June 17 – July 7, 2017 (3 weeks)

Housewares, appliances, electronics, toys, soft goods, sporting goods, tools, furniture/lighting and other lifestyle products are just some of the items that product designers create. Under the direct guidance of Professor Stan Kong, 10-15 students will have the opportunity to explore educational and career opportunities related to the product design profession. Beginning students learn fundamental design processes and techniques through hands-on projects.

Through daily workshops, beginning design students will be introduced to the industrial design fields, which include product, transportation, environmental, entertainment and interactive design. Students will also undertake design projects while gaining exposure to Art Center and college life.

Prerequisites: Basic skills in sketching or alternative art form, an interest in pursuing art, experience or knowledge of Keynote or PowerPoint, and a laptop computer for research and project presentations.
