Recommended Preparation: eligibility for English 1A. This course provides a multidisciplinary introduction and analysis of ethnic groups in the United States. Various theories and perspectives will be examined to better comprehend the effects of institutional racism, marginalization, socio-economic and political discrimination, and ethnocentrism on American ethnic and racial groups.</li> <li>Starts Monday, 8/27/2018</li> <li>Meets on DVC Campus, Room 3203</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Through West Los Angeles College</li> <li>Mondays and Wednesdays 3:00-4:25</li> <li>Course Description: Students will learn to recognize the importance of the First Amendment, define the process of sending and delivering messages, scrutinize feedback, analyze audiences; and, in addition, research, organize and prepare speeches that are focused, detailed, and cite attribution, utilizing outlines for delivery. Attention will be paid to relaxation exercises, eye contact, body language, podium presence, the pause, articulation, and voice projection and pacing. The role of the listener will be examined as will self-evaluation. Informative, persuasive, and argumentative speeches will be taught.</li> <li>Starts Monday, 8/27/2018</li> </ul>
