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Students started the unit of Evolution which focuses on the essential question "How do species change over time to survive in different environmental conditions?" We'll study the legacy of Charles Darwin and his contributions in developing the mechanisms of Natural Selection that drive evolution. Students are challenged to see if Charles Darwin had a strong theory of evolution based on evidence. We currently live in a time when words such as "fake news" are common in our political newsfeeds, so it is very important for students to develop the ability to make decisions and form opinions based on concrete evidence from reliable sources even if it is unpopular.

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We have started off 2020 studying the original 'roaring 20s' in preparation for our study of F. Scott Fitzgerald's The Great Gatsby . The students will continue to develop their reading comprehension skills while also making connections between 2020 and the 1920s. I am looking forward to introducing the novel this month and getting the students excited to find out all about the mysterious Gatsby.

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Students are entering into a study of the Cold War. The primary focus and project of this unit is current events. The United States is going through such a historic and tumultuous period in its history, so much of which has direct Cold War origins, which makes a perfect opportunity for students to see the impact of history in their home country. Hence, it is recommended starting now and continuing during this unit, that students pay attention to news and talk with their parents regarding current events and news in order to find a topic for their presentation and prepare for it.

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Students will be focusing on the development of their business plan by researching multiple business competitors and developing their "ask". Knowing how they compare to other businesses in the same product/service realm and being able to present a possible investor with an opportunity to help to grow their business is a major part of the overall business plan.

ENTRPREVERSHIP KAUTOUYA DIXON

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Students will be extending their knowledge of inverses to exponential functions and logarithms. We will do a lab to understand the Scoville scale of the hotness of peppers. We will then investigate the inflation in Venezuela to better understand how exponentials and logarithmic relationships apply to the real world. In Precalculus students ended studying area under the curve and will now focus on reviewing polynomials to access rationals and do a Boolean summary of the thinking necessary to graph a rational function.
