



# COVID Safety Reminders

#### When there is a potential COVID exposure:

We will "contact trace" and find out who is a close contact. If you are a close contact, the nurse will discuss quarantine options (different for vaccinated vs unvaccinated, different if you choose to test during quarantine or not).

- If they are a close contact, staff and families will be notified.
- If there was a case in the classroom, but they are NOT a close contact, staff and families will still receive a general notice.

#### Remember: Health information is confidential.

The school will share all information possible to help keep everyone safe. We must not make assumptions or spread rumors.

### What can we do to stay safe?

**Self-Screening**. All students and staff will be required to self-screen at home and stay off campus if experiencing any COVID symptoms or if there was a close contact with a COVID positive person in the past 10 days.

 If you are unable to come to campus due to your self-screen, please contact principal and school nurse for next steps including testing options and return to school timelines.

Wear your mask, and wear it correctly (over nose and mouth).

Keep your distance, especially during lunch while unmasked/eating.



## Going Home Sick / If you are sick at home

Students who have COVID-like symptoms (fever, new cough, vomit/diarrhea, loss taste/smell) at any point during the school day are given a medical grade mask and accompanied to a preselected isolation space where they can remain while arrangements are made for their immediate return home.

To return to school (or if you have symptoms at home) you need to:

- ✗ Be symptom free for 24 hours <u>PLUS</u>
- A doctor's note saying your symptoms were NOT COVID <u>OR</u> a negative COVID test

Free COVID testing is available on campus M-F.

\*If you choose not to see doctor or get tested you must stay home for 10 days

Mastery based grading is a system that provides meaningful feedback to students and parents so that excellence can be achieved.

As it is our goal for students to show improvement toward mastery, students will have multiple opportunities to demonstrate their knowledge and skills.

# Mastery-Based Grading

### 80% Essential Skills & 20% Habits of Mind

- ► A, B, C, I (Incomplete)
- ► Allow for revisions/retakes
- ► Formative vs. Summative Assessments
  - Provide feedback for formative assessment and grade book marks for summative

# Mastery-Based Grading

- Meaningful feedback
- Identify strengths and weaknesses
- Separate academic struggles from behavioral ones

# Presentations of Learning (POL) Logistics

- POLs replace traditional exams
- Students defend the skill, knowledge, and application of skills they have acquired of the course of the semester in all classes excluding advisory and seminar.
- POLs help student show mastery in a specific skill they struggled with earlier in the semester.
- The new POL grade replaces that ESK average

- It will be listed in a separate column on your report card.

To show off your hard work, and talk about the process, growth, and results




