



Fall 2025 All-DV Dual Enrollment Opportunities with El Camino College



Da Vinci Schools is partnering with El Camino College to offer three dual enrollment courses in the Fall 2025 term. All three courses are online and asynchronous.

El Camino's fall term classes begin on August 25, 2025. Students who have never completed the El Camino College application should complete and submit it prior to August 22.

Da Vinci will be holding application "office hours" for students needing assistance with completing their application in the RWL Center computer lab (1st floor) on Tuesday 8/18 from 4:00pm-5:00pm. Students should know their SSN# (if they have one) and whether or not their family is considered a military family when they apply.

To be eligible to take a dual enrollment class, students need to be in grades 10-12 and be in good academic standing. Space is limited. See Dual Enrollment counselors for details.

<p>BUS 101- Introduction to Business (Asynchronous, Online)</p> <p>3 units</p>	<p>This course is a survey of organization and management factors influencing the establishment, location, and operation of businesses. This course emphasizes the functional area of accounting as well as the legal framework within which business activities are conducted. The course also emphasizes the principles of Total Quality Management (TQM) in a multicultural and globalized environment.</p>
<p>ENG C1000 - Academic Reading & Writing (Asynchronous, Online)</p> <p>3 units</p>	<p>In this course, students receive instruction in academic reading and writing, including writing processes, effective use of language, analytical thinking, and the foundations of academic research. Emphasis will be placed on the ability to write an essay in which each paragraph relates to a controlling idea, has an introduction and conclusion, and contains primary and secondary support. College-level reading material will be assigned to provide the stimulus for class discussion and writing assignments, including a required research paper.</p>
<p>FILM 110- Film Analysis and Appreciation (Asynchronous, Online)</p> <p>3 units</p>	<p>This course provides an introduction to the art and language of film. It covers the critical analysis of film form, narrative structures, genres, and the historical development of cinema. The course explores the major elements of film, including cinematography, editing, sound, and production design, as well as the cultural, social, and ideological contexts in which films are made and received. Students will view and discuss a variety of films, developing skills in film analysis and an appreciation for the artistic and cultural significance of cinema.</p>
