



Fall 2026 All-DV Dual Enrollment Opportunities with El Camino College



Da Vinci Schools is partnering with El Camino College to offer dual enrollment courses in the Fall 2026 term. **El Camino's spring term classes begin on August 24, 2026.** Students who have never completed the El Camino College application should see their dual enrollment counselor for instructions on applying to ECC (the application process takes several days).

To be eligible to take a dual enrollment class, students need to be in grades 10-12 and be in good academic standing. Space is limited. See Dual Enrollment counselors for details.

ENG C1000 - Academic Reading & Writing (3 units) (Asynchronous, Online) Counts as one year toward the UC/CSU "B" (English) requirement	In this course, students receive instruction in academic reading and writing, including writing processes, effective use of language, analytical thinking, and the foundations of academic research. Emphasis will be placed on the ability to write an essay in which each paragraph relates to a controlling idea, has an introduction and conclusion, and contains primary and secondary support. College-level reading material will be assigned to provide the stimulus for class discussion and writing assignments, including a required research paper.
NUTR 110 - Nutrition & Life Science (3 units) (Asynchronous, Online) Counts as one year toward the UC/CSU "G" (Elective) requirement	This course is an introduction to the fundamental principles of nutrition utilizing the scientific method and dietary approaches to health and wellness. Nutrients will be identified, along with their physiological functions, metabolic pathways and role in diet and disease. Additional topics will include food science, the application of food safety principles and lifecycle nutrition.
FILM 110- Film Analysis and Appreciation (3 units) (Asynchronous, Online) Counts as one year toward the UC/CSU "F" (Visual & Performing Arts) requirement	This course provides an introduction to the art and language of film. It covers the critical analysis of film form, narrative structures, genres, and the historical development of cinema. The course explores the major elements of film, including cinematography, editing, sound, and production design, as well as the cultural, social, and ideological contexts in which films are made and received. Students will view and discuss a variety of films, developing skills in film analysis and an appreciation for the artistic and cultural significance of cinema.
HDEV 110 - Strategies for Creating Success in College and in Life (3 units) (Asynchronous, Online) Counts as one year toward the UC/CSU "G" (Elective) requirement	This course provides an exploration of cognitive, psychological, social and physical factors influencing success. Topics include personal responsibility, critical thinking, motivation, self-efficacy, lifelong learning, health and wellness, and interpersonal communication in a diverse world. Students will identify and utilize strategies and resources for success in college, careers, and life. <i>Offered to LifeLaunch students in the fall and all DV students in the spring.</i>
COMS 100 - Public Speaking (IN PERSON) (3 units) Mon & Wed 4:00-5:30pm @201 N. Douglas St. campus Counts as one year toward the UC/CSU "G" (Elective) requirement	In this course, students will compose, present, and evaluate original speeches. Emphasis is placed on audience analysis, topic selection, research, evidence, organization, delivery, and critical analysis of persuasive communication. Students are required to attend out-of-class speaking events.
